



The LIFE Emergency relief fund was launched to raise money for 14 carefully selected projects from a list of NGOs in Lebanon which focus on supporting some of the most vulnerable Lebanese communities across the nation.

This fund was launched at the beginning of 2020 as a response to the rapidly deteriorating economic situation.

Close to 80% of the funding has already been dispersed serving over 30,000 beneficiaries to date.

Ongoing Projects




Lebanon Needs aim to provide medical assistance to 496 individuals by securing their medication for a period of 11 months. To date, Lebanon Needs has covered medications for 6 months. The project is expected to be completed in April 2021.

Beit El Baraka utilised the funds collected to set up a permaculture farm in West Beqaa. Since June 2020, Beit El Baraka completed the installation of concrete water tanks, irrigation systems, and constructed a wooden cabin to host the team and store tools and equipment. They are currently planting winter seedlings to prepare for the months ahead and by January 2021 they plan to complete the installation of solar panels to produce clean energy.

SESOBEL

SESOBEL initially planned to cover 1,620 respiratory therapies for 16 children with cerebral palsy and neuromuscular disorders. To date, they have completed 515 sessions. They expected to cover 1,620 sessions in a period of 12 months but faced delays due to the fear of families in exposing their children to doctors due to COVID-19. Over the months of November and December 2020 they expect to cover 312 additional sessions.

The Lebanese Food Bank (LFB) plans to expand their warehouse from 200 to 1,500 sqm. The expansion process includes installation of steel doors, repairing of the super structure and installation of ventilation, kitchen and cold rooms. The works were delayed due to Covid-19 and then the Beirut blast on 4th August. The LFB is currently reviewing the new cost of repairs and is planning to launch the works in January 2021.

Completed Projects



Association for the Protection of the Environment were supported in the provision of food kits to 400 fishermen and their families for a period of 2 months. The Association worked closely with a fishermen community based in Tyre to provide them with food kits to relieve them from the economic burden.

Association du Rassemblement des fils de Baalbeck utilised the allocated funds to distribute 600 food kits for 2 months to destitute families in Baalbeck. They also distributed fuel to 332 families during the month of October 2020.

Al Ghina association was supported in the provision of 1,400 food kits for families over a period of 1 month. As the economic conditions deteriorate in Lebanon, families all around the country are being denied their minimal human rights to have access to proper nutrition. Therefore, Al Ghina have proposed to concentrate on Bekaa, Mount Lebanon and Beirut.

Sanabel El Nour has utilised the allocated funds to distribute food kits to 600 families in Tripoli and Donniyeh for a period of 1 month, and the distribution of bread to 400 families in Tripoli for a period of 1 month.

TAHADDI

Tahaddi supported 100 economically at-risk Lebanese families who lack official IDs by providing them with food vouchers for a period of 4 months. This alleviated the pressure on the families and allowed them to temporarily sustain themselves.

Upgrading the Tender Society distributed 660 food kits to families in Akkar during the month of July 2020. They reached different types of beneficiaries including widows, orphans, taxi drivers, and teachers to provide basic social services during the current challenging socio-economic situation.

Arcenciel was supported on two separate projects related to medical assistance for destitute Lebanese individuals. The project distributed 15,922 diapers to 343 beneficiaries. The second project focused on supporting the Social Pharmacy which provided 2,939 chronic medication for over 704 beneficiaries. The duration of both projects was 6 months and ended in October 2020.

CHANCE was able to contribute to the partial chemotherapy and radiotherapy costs for 50 of the 200 children fighting cancer and blood disorders. The funds collected also covered partial cost of surgery, biopsy, specialised imaging and laboratory tests, supporting 37% of treatment expenses of the children.

IRAP was initially planning to build an industrial kitchen to boost their sales of in-house food production which presents 41% of the organisations income. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the funds collected were re-allocated to ensure the provision of salaries for its staff of around 85 employees, 50% of which have special needs.

Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, DSC re-allocated the LIFE funding to cover the payroll expenses of the operators, as they doubled their shifts and efforts to be able to maintain the required number of blood supply and keep the Contact Center up and running 24/7. This led to securing over 4,500 patients with blood units over a period of 3 months.
